

COCKROACH 3 STEP TREATMENT GUIDE

Step 1: Clean Step 2: Treat Step 3: Monitor

CLEANING:

IS SOMETHING LEFT TO THE TENANT OR HOMEOWNER. This must be done at the beginning of treatment and throughout the entire process. It sounds excessive but if something is left unclean, roaches can and will find it which hinders our ability to help you solve your problem.

Below is a list of items to clean over the treatment period; we may add to this list over time as we deem necessary - this is a starting guide.

Clean (water):

Another way to keep roach infestations at bay, and a natural roach control solution, will be to remove as many water sources for the roaches as possible. Consider the following water sources:

Fix leaky plumbing and sweating pipes.

Before bed, dry all sinks, tubs, and showers completely and plug the drains.

- Place wet dish rags and sponges in an airtight plastic storage bag overnight, place them directly in the washing machine, or hang outdoors to dry.
- Pet water dishes should be placed outside overnight or be dried and refilled in the morning.
 - Wet toothbrushes should be dried as best they can and placed in sealed bags or containers.
- Empty drip tray from under refrigerator.





Fix leaky plumbing

Dry all sinks & plug the drains



Place wet dish towels immediately in the washer



Dry wet toothbrushes and seal them in a bag

CPMA - ACGP



Remove pet water dish each night



Empty water tray and drip tray from under your refrigerator



Clean (food):





Clean all SMALL & MAJOR kitchen appliances thoroughly



Clean inside of toaster



All food needs to be in sealed containers.



Clean kitchen before bed each night



Empty pet food containers



Empty and clean cupboards




Limit food to one room.



Clean the floor frequently



Keep garbage clean & covered











TREATING:

TREATING IS LEFT TO US. We use the most modern treatments and pesticides. We cycle through pesticides so as to ensure the roaches do not build up a tolerance. Also, like humans, roaches can be interested in one bait and not another.

Roaches do not want their bait tampered with. After bait is placed do not use harsh cleaners/chemicals (ie. bleach) as it can make the bait unattractive and push the roaches to other locations in the structure. Only in very rare situations will one treatment work.



MONITORING:

MONITORING IS A MUTUAL RESPONSIBILITY.

Like you, we want to resolve this problem as quickly as possible. It doesn't hurt between services for you to check the monitoring stations left out to ensure the problem is going the right direction. Roach problems can take time to resolve. IMPORTANT NOTE:

Do not under any circumstances apply any chemical yourself. This can scatter the roaches to other locations and make the problem worse.
